

Pentangle Gives Thanks

We are in the season of giving and giving thanks. I personally want to thank our donors, business sponsors, and town voters who make it possible for us to continue to enhance our area's cultural and economic vitality through the presentation of affordable and accessible arts programming for all to enjoy. Community support is also critical to the less visible but critical work we do to maintain and improve the theatre and all the technical equipment that enhance the patron experience whether it be for a movie or a live theatrical or musical production.

While we are a small non-profit organization, we aim to do big things. For example, by the end of 2019 we will have screened 52 feature films attended by nearly 10,000 patrons, and will have presented 25 live performances including live musical theatre for area youth that taken together will be attended by over 8,000 people. And that does not even include fundraisers for area non-profits, community productions, after school and summer dance and performance camps, and in-school residencies.

Again, none of this would be possible without community support for which we are immensely grateful.
