Selectboard and Trustees to Hear Presentation on Town Hall Rejuvenation Project

he Town Hall Rejuvenation Project (THRP) leadership team will give a major presentation on the status of the project at a special combined Woodstock Selectboard and Trustees meeting on Monday evening, November 15. The meeting was requested by members of both boards to get up to speed on the complex project.

The leadership team will present several plans with cost estimates, followed by questions from Selectboard members, Trustees, and the public. The team has been examining serious issues such as potential instability of the addition that houses the theatre stage in the event of a flood, along with federal disability act requirements for employees and visitors, heating and air conditioning deficiencies, a desire for new theatre seats, and the potential for an upgraded lobby/concession area and renovated public restrooms.

With privately donated funds, the leadership team has gathered expert recommendations and commissioned preliminary drawings, along with cost estimates for three plans ranging in complexity and cost. Financing for the project would come from a combination of private donations, public fundraising, grants, and taxpayers through a bond payment approved by voters.

I urge Town and Village residents to come to the meeting in person or via zoom. It is a wonderful opportunity to learn more about the Town Hall Rejuvenation project, and the options to ensure the building remains a cultural and civic hub for years to come.

I can't tell you how many people I've welcomed into the theatre itself over the past eight years, from tourists, Broadway and community actors, musicians, new residents, and longtime residents who appreciate and cherish the unique space.

The building itself has stood as a sentinel watching a small village grow from the time of its construction in 1899 when it was at the far end of town to its now central location.

Too often public forums organized to inform and seek input from residents, are poorly attended, with comments and concerns raised after the train has left the station. Please mark your calendars and make a point to attend and have a voice in the future of the iconic Town Hall Building.

The presentation begins at 6:00 pm, in the Town Hall or on Zoom [LINK], with questions starting at 7:00 pm. Preregistration, a mask, and either proof of vaccination or a negative Covid test will be required to attend in person. For further information on the project, go to www.woodstockthrp.org
