Mystic Bowie and The Talking Dreads Come to Woodstock

This Friday, July 16th we are pleased to welcome Mystic Bowie and the Talking Dreads. Charismatic Jamaican-born singer and performer, Mystic Bowie debuted the Talking Dreads Project Live at the High Times Music Festival on the beach in Negril, Jamaica in late 2015. Since then, he has electrified audiences across North America

The road to the Talking Dreads Project Live began in 1996 when Bowie joined the Tom Tom Club and began a close personal and professional relationship with Chris Frantz and Tina Weymouth, founding members of the Tom Tom Club and Talking Heads. He performed with them for nearly 20 years and appeared on their 2000 album *The Good, The Bad and the Funky*.

Talking Dreads is more than a cover band as it draws on musical culture while preserving the integrity of the Talking Heads songs. Bowie kept the lyrics but replaced all the instrumentation with a blend of reggae and Caribbean music.

Youth V Gov

Youth V Gov screens from July 12th-26th as part of Sustainable Woodstock and Pentangle Arts' Climate and Sustainability Film Series.

The film follows the story of America's youth taking on the world's most powerful government, filing a ground-breaking lawsuit against the U.S. government. They assert it has willfully acted over six decades to create the climate crisis, thus endangering their constitutional rights to life, liberty, and property.

The Juliana plaintiffs, represented by the legal non-profit Our Children's Trust, represent the diversity of America's youth impacted by the climate crisis. Hailing from across the country, they encompass cultural, economic racial, and geographic diversity, with many from marginalized communities, and their stories are universal. Their diversity speaks not only to the impacts of climate change, but to the inclusion required if we are to build a better, more just future together. If these young people are successful, they will not only make history, they will change the future.
