Pentangle shows award-winning documentary 'The Book Keepers'

e are pleased to present the award-winning documentary The Book Keepers as part of Middlebury's New Directors Film Festival, on April 1, 2023 at 6:00 pm. There will be a reception and book signing at 5:00 pm with the film's director, Phil Wall, who also produced and edited the film.

The film documents the cross-country tour Phil (who has directed three other award-winning films) made with his father Dick Wall to promote his mother Carol's memoir Mister Owita's Guide to Gardening. The book about cancer, friendship, and cultivating an open heart was a breakout success. But joy turned to tragedy when the breast cancer she wrote about returned. She died nine months after its publication, and one week before it was named a Top 10 Book of the Year by both USA Today and AARP. Never once speaking on behalf of her life-affirming book, Carol made a simple request of her youngest son, Phil, before her death: "You take care of our book."

About The Film

The iconic statues and sensationalized "mysteries" of Easter Island (Rapa Nui) have drawn the interest of the world for centuries, attracting curious visitors to its shores. Today, this tiny, barren island is experiencing an economic boon as tourism skyrockets. Yet the indigenous culture and the island's fragile environment are suffering.

The film, directed by native Rapanui filmmaker Sergio Mata'u Rapu, explores the dilemma his people are facing. Crafted as a story passed down to his newborn son, Sergio intertwines the authentic history of the island with the stories of four islanders.
